- This the first of two letters that He writes in the New Testament
- Theme of the letter: Reward of suffering, steadfastness, holiness

It was worth it for the Israelites in order to make it to the Promised Land of Canaan. It is worth it for us to endure suffering as we await our Promised Land (Heaven).</p>
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<p><b>DAY 39 (TUES)</b>  <b>Exodus 19-20</b>  <b>1 Peter 2</b></p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p><u>Ch. 19:</u> God comes down on Mount Sinai</p> <p><u>Ch.20:</u> Moses delivers Ten Commandments</p> <p><b>1 PETER 2</b></p> <p><u>Ch. 2:</u> How to live as people of God, call to submission to authority</p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p>19:1: Mount Sinai is a prominent area. The Israelites remained there for 1 year.</p> <p>19:9-25: These were measures that had to be performed because of God's holiness</p> <p>20:1-17: These are the Ten Commandments. There were a total of 613 laws, but are all based on these 10. In the New Testament, Jesus sums all these laws down to Matthew 22:35-40.</p> <p><b>1 PETER</b></p> <p>2:5: Refer to Romans 12:1  2:6: Refer to Isaiah 28:16, Romans 9:33  2:7: Refer to Ps. 118:22  2:8: Refer to Isaiah 8:14  2:22-25: This is the gospel story</p>	<p>God is a God of order. God commands things from His people.</p>	<p>Exodus 19:5-6 +1 Peter 2:9</p> <p>Obedience is beneficial. Note the reference to priesthood in both verses</p>
<p><b>DAY 40 (WED)</b>  <b>Exodus 21-22</b>  <b>1 Peter 3</b></p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p><u>Ch.21:</u> Laws about treatment of servants, laws against violence</p> <p><u>Ch.22:</u> Laws of repayment and human relation</p> <p><b>1 PETER 3</b></p> <p><u>Ch. 3:</u> Advice to wives/husbands, The blessing in suffering</p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p>3:1-4: Refer to 1 Timothy 2:9-15  3:18-22: Peter always points back to Jesus and what He did</p>	<p>God is a God of order. He was specific in what He commanded.</p>

He was specific in what He commanded.</p>	
<p><b>DAY 42 (FRI)</b>  <b>Exodus 25-26</b>  <b>1 Peter 5</b></p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p><u>Ch.25:</u> Instructions regarding gifts to bring for the tent/altar, building of the Ark of the Covenant, Table of Shewbread</p> <p><u>Ch.26:</u> Commandments/Instructions on how to build the tabernacle</p> <p><b>1 PETER 5</b></p> <p><u>Ch.5:</u> Addressing leaders/elders, humility, the reward in suffering</p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p>25:14: The ark of the Covenant housed God's presence. It was so holy that these poles were used to carry it so that they didn't touch the ark itself.</p> <p>26:31-35: This veil is very important regarding the gospel story. Refer to Matthew 27:51 to read of the veil being torn (this is what Jesus's sacrifice did).</p> <p><b>1 PETER</b></p> <p>5:13: "she"= the church</p>	<p>God was specific in His instructions for a reason. Everything that He does is Sovereign and with intent. We must obey just as precisely as He instructed.</p>	

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<p><b>DAY 43 (SAT)</b>  <b>Exodus 27-28</b>  <b>Psalm 96</b></p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p><u>Ch.27:</u> Instructions for the altar of burnt offering, building the enclosure of the tabernacle</p> <p><u>Ch.28:</u> Instructions for the priests' clothes</p> <p><b>PSALM</b></p> <p><u>Ch.96:</u> Praises to God, Come into His courts to praise Him</p>	<p><b>EXODUS</b></p> <p>27:20: Note that pure oil was needed, with no impurities. Only the best was allowed into the tabernacle.</p> <p>Ch.28: Priests were in a high position of leadership. Refer to 1 Peter 2:9, where we are now considered to be the royal priesthood</p> <p>28:33-35: This shows the intensity of a priest entering into the Most Holy Place on the day of Atonement (the bell was there to make sure they were still alive in the presence of God)</p>	<p>God held the priests to a certain standard. Now we are the royal priesthood. We too are held to a high standard to be set apart from the world.</p>	<p>Exodus 27 + Psalm 96</p> <p>Both passages speak of God's courts (tabernacle), where worship occurs.</p>

- This is his second visit to them
- Believed to have been written about A.D. 54 or 55 (approximately 8 months after his first letter)
- Theme: The duty of Christians, being faithful to Christ

### INTRO TO LEVITICUS

- 3rd book of the Old Testament (1st 5 books are labeled as the Pentateuch)
- Lists out the duties of the Levites

He heard Moses' prayer as he asked the Lord not to kindle his anger towards the Israelites.

We should pray the veil to come off of the eyes of unbeliever</p>	<p>God's holiness is evident and consistent.</p>	<p>Exodus 34 + 2 Cor 3:7-8</p> <p>This refers to the tablets with Moses on Mount Sinai and Moses's face radiating after being in God's presence.</p> <p>Exodus 34:30-35 + 2 Cor 3:13-16</p> <p>Both passages refer to a veil covering a face.</p>
<p><b>Day 47 (WED)</b>  <b>Exodus 35-36</b>  <b>2 Corinthians 4</b></p>	<p><b>Exodus</b></p> <p><u>Ch.35:</u> God gives instructions for Sabbath, and for various things needed in tabernacle</p> <p><u>Ch.36:</u> Building the tabernacle</p> <p><b>2 Corinthians 4</b></p> <p><u>Ch.4:</u> Emphasis on being renewed, encouragement to keep going</p>	<p><b>Exodus</b></p> <p>35:20-21: Notice their response after hearing instruction from God. This is a great example to learn from</p> <p><b>2 Corinthians</b></p> <p>4:6: Refer to Gen 1:3</p> <p>4:13: Refer to Psalm 116:10</p>	<p>God is intentional in how He meets us, instructs us, and commands us.</p>	

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<p><b>Day 48 (THURS)</b>  <b>Exodus 37-38</b>  <b>2 Corinthians 5</b></p>	<p><b>Exodus</b></p> <p><u>Ch.37:</u> Making the ark of the Covenant and other parts of the temple</p> <p><u>Ch.38:</u> Israelites continue to build temple, total cost of tabernacle is discussed</p> <p><b>2 Corinthians</b></p> <p><u>Ch.5:</u> Encouragement to keep going/ live for Christ, emphasis on the gospel</p>	<p><b>Exodus</b></p> <p>38:23-31: 1 talent is approximately 75 lbs. (Try doing the math to see total cost of tabernacle)</p> <p><b>2 Corinthians</b></p> <p>5:1: This is referring to earthly and heavenly body</p> <p>5:2-4: Referring to natural earthly body</p> <p>5:6-9: This is encouragement that we will one day be with Him, but until then, live pleasing to God</p> <p>5:19: This is the gospel</p>	<p>God is intentional in how He meets us, instructs us, and commands us.</p>	
<p><b>Day 49 (FRI)</b>  <b>Exodus 39-40</b>  <b>2 Corinthians 6</b></p>	<p><b>Exodus</b></p> <p>Ch.39: Making of the priests' clothes, The making of the tabernacle is complete</p> <p>Ch.40: The Israelites set up tabernacle for use, God's glory fill the temple</p> <p><b>2 Corinthians</b></p> <p>Ch.6: Paul writes in transparency, the call to be set apart</p>	<p><b>Exodus</b></p> <p>39:21: They followed the instructions JUST as the Lord had commanded</p> <p>40:34: This was the same cloud guiding them on their journey</p> <p>40:35: God's presence is so holy and powerful.</p> <p>40:36-38: They followed and waited on God's presence. So should we.</p> <p><b>2 Corinthians</b></p> <p>6:2: Refer to Isaiah 49:8</p> <p>6:16: Refer to Exodus 29:45</p> <p>6:17: Refer to Isaiah 52:11</p> <p>6:18: Refer to Jeremiah 31:1, 9</p>	<p>God is specific in instruction and wants us to be specific in our obedience. Also, God's presence is so holy and powerful.</p>	<p>Exodus 39, 40 + 2 Cor 6:16</p> <p>Both passages discuss the temple of God. Note the difference from the Old Testament to the New Testament. In the Old Testament, the tabernacle was a physical building. In the New Testament, we are now the temple of God. God's presence now dwells within us.</p>

It looks different now in the Old Testament, but sacrifice is still required of the Lord.</p>

Reading the OT helps us to have more appreciation for what Jesus came to earth to do.</p>

<p><b>DAY 53 (TUES)</b>  <b>Leviticus 8-10;</b>  <b>2 Corinthians 10</b></p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b>            Ch.8: Moses ordains Aaron and sons in the temple</p> <p>Ch.9: Aaron performs sacrifice and God's glory appears in the temple</p> <p>Ch.10: Sin &amp; punishment of Nadab and Abihu, Roles for new priests</p> <p><b>2 CORINTHIANS</b>            Ch.10: Paul speaks about mental/spiritual warfare, and he explains his style of teaching and his walk with Jesus</p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b></p> <p>9:23: When Aaron performed the sacrifice as God commanded, God's glory appeared</p> <p>10:1-2: When we don't do thing specifically as God has instructed, there is punishment</p>	<p>God's instructions are specific and detailed for a reason. We must trust His Sovereignty as we follow His commands.</p>	<p>Ex 9:23 &amp; 10:1-2 + 2 Cor. 10:6</p> <p>Both passages speak to disobedience and obedience and the results/outcome.</p>
<p><b>DAY 54 (WED)</b>  <b>Leviticus 11;</b>  <b>2 Corinthians 11;</b>  <b>Psalms 56</b></p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b>            Ch.11: Law of unclean/clean animals</p> <p><b>2 CORINTHIANS</b>            Ch.11: False teachers, Paul explains suffering and hard times he has endured</p> <p><b>PSALMS</b>            Ch.56: Psalm of Trust</p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b>            11:44-45: This was a call for them to remember God's holiness &amp; Sovereignty</p>	<p>God, in His sovereignty and might, is faithful to deliver. We can trust Him.</p>	<p>2 Cor 11:24-33 + Psalm 56</p> <p>Both passages show how God delivers in times of trouble. Both David and Paul endured hard times, but they speak of how God delivered them and was faithful to protect them.</p> <p>Note how Lev. 11:44-45 fits into this as well. God brought the Israelites out of captivity and was faithful to keep them on their journey (we will see more as we keep reading).</p>

<p><b>DAY 55 (THURS)</b>  <b>Leviticus 12-13;</b>  <b>2 Corinthians 12</b></p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b>            Ch.12: Childbirth &amp; Purification Laws            Ch.13: Laws about leprosy</p> <p><b>2 CORINTHIANS</b>            Ch.12: Pauls speaks of his visions/revelation and shares more about his suffering</p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b>            12:6-8: Note Luke 2:24. This is the law Mary abided by as he brought offering for Jesus' birth</p> <p>13:5, 45-46: Leprosy was highly contagious, so lepers had to go through extensive procedures as they lived, including extreme quarantine from the public.</p> <p><b>2 CORINTHIANS</b>            12:7-8: The "thorn in my flesh" that Paul refers to is unknown. Most scholars believe it was a physical ailment.</p>		<p>Lev 13 + 2 Cor. 12:7-8</p> <p>Both passages refer to ailments. Although Paul's ailment ("thorn in my flesh") is unknown, both show the life of having to live with a life-altering condition. This makes the reality of Jesus healing lepers and using Paul to preach the gospel even that much more of a miracle.</p>
<p><b>DAY 56 (FRI)</b>  <b>Leviticus 14-15;</b>  <b>2 Corinthians 13</b></p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b>            Ch.14: Law regarding cleansing of lepers and infected houses</p> <p>Ch.15: Laws of cleansing regarding bodily discharge (there were laws for everything!)</p> <p><b>2 CORINTHIANS</b>            Ch.13: Paul shares desire to return in Corinth, and shares the beauty/power in weakness</p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b>            15:17-33: Note how things have changed regarding menstrual periods</p> <p>15:25: Note Matthew 9:20-22, Mark 5:25-34, Luke 8:43-48. This is the story of the woman with the issue of blood. These laws in Ch.15 where what she would have to abide by, but she "broke" tradition/laws to get to Jesus</p> <p><b>2 CORINTHIANS</b>            13:4 Paul always points to the gospel</p>

<p><b>DAY 57 (SAT)</b></p> <p><b>Leviticus 16-18</b> <b>1 John 1;</b></p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b> Ch.16: Laws of Day of Atonement Ch.17: Sacredness of blood Ch.18: Laws against sexual immorality and various practices</p> <p><b>1 JOHN</b> Ch.1: Paul encourages the church to “walk in the light” &amp; also to acknowledge their sin</p>	<p><b>LEVITICUS</b> 16:2,14: Note the “veil” and the “most holy place”. Correlate that with Ex. 26:31-35</p> <p>18:21: Molech: This refers to an idolatrous practice of human sacrifice</p> <p><b>1 JOHN</b> 1:1-3: Very similar introduction to John 1:1-5</p>	<p>God is holy. God does not like sin. That has never changed since the beginning of time. We as believers must acknowledge, repent and turn from our sin.</p>	<p>Lev. 16 + 1 John 1</p> <p>Both passages bring clarity to sin and show how God views sin.</p>

### INTRO TO NUMBERS:

- 4th Old Testament book
- The book is named “Numbers” because one major themes is the census of the people on their journey
- Majority of the Israelites’ wilderness journey is found in this book
