In OT, God spoke to Moses from "between the two cherubim". This Psalm makes mention of God being "enthroned upon the cherubim".</p>

God will continue to do that for us in our personal spiritual journey as well.</p>	
<p>DAY 67 (TUES) MARCH 8</p> <p>NUMBERS 11-12 2 TIMOTHY 2</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.11: God sends fire of anger, Israelites' ungrateful with manna, God sends quail, God rests spirit on elders</p> <p>Ch.12: Miriam gets punished with leprosy for complaining against Moses</p> <p>2 TIMOTHY</p> <p>Ch.2: Soldiers in army of the Lord, the call to live a godly example for people</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>11:6: They were complaining about Godly provision</p> <p>11:11: Moses was frustrated as a leader having to deal with ungrateful people</p> <p>11:25: This shows that when the Spirit of God rests on you, things change</p> <p>12:14: Remember the leprosy laws</p> <p>2 TIMOTHY</p> <p>2:8-9: This points back to the gospel</p>	<p>God has righteous anger when His people disobey him. His holiness is what leads Him to judgment. Yet, even His anger towards the Israelites, He also was patient with them. He still is patient with His people today.</p>

<p>DAY 68 (WED) MARCH 9</p> <p>NUMBERS 13-14 2 TIMOTHY 3</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.13: Sending 12 spies to Canaan</p> <p>Ch.14: Israel complaining, God punishes generation and withholds them from entering into Promised Land</p> <p>2 TIMOTHY</p> <p>Ch.3: End times, living a godly life</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>13:16: Hoshea was converted to the name Joshua</p> <p>13:25: This 40 days is important</p> <p>13:30: Caleb had faith</p> <p>14:7-9: Joshua and Caleb had faith even though the other Israelites didn't</p> <p>14:24: Joshua's faith brought HIM FAVOR</p> <p>14:20-35: This was the punishment for that current generation. God still kept His promise and would allow the Israelites to enter the Promised Land, but not this specific generation.</p> <p>14:34: We see the importance of the 40 days (Num.13:25)</p> <p>2 TIMOTHY</p> <p>3:2-5: Sounds similar to today's times</p>	<p>God honors faith. God also is a man of His word. He keeps His promises and will fulfill them, even when it doesn't look like what we expect.</p>

<p>DAY 73 MARCH 14</p> <p>NUMBERS 22 JOHN 4</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.22: Balak calls Balaam to curse Israelites, God speaks to Balaam through a donkey</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.4: Samaritan woman encounters Jesus at the well, Jesus heals official's son</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>22:12: God protects/vindicates His people</p> <p>22:18-20: We should have a similar response when tempted with disobedience, to seek the Lord constantly regarding decisions to make</p> <p>22:22: This verse has been highly discussed and debated. Scholars believe that God's anger was kindled because Balaam had other sinful motives (refer to 22:32)</p> <p>22:23-31: Balaam didn't see the angle of the Lord, God had to open his eyes</p> <p>22:28: God will use anything to get our attention</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>4:6: Jesus being weary shows that Jesus was human</p> <p>4:10: There are multiple interpretations of "gift of God", but the most popular interpretation is that this is referring to Jesus Christ</p> <p>4:25: Everyone had been anticipating the Messiah</p>	<p>God will do whatever is necessary to get our attention. We must pray for our eyes and ears to be opened to see God in all things as He speaks.</p>

He will not let curses come to them.</p>	<p>John 5:45-5:47 + entire OT</p> <p>This passage in John explains the eternal existence of Jesus and Jesus being the focal point of scripture. All Scripture leads to and is about Jesus.</p>
<p>DAY 75 MARCH 16</p> <p>NUMBERS 24 JOHN 6</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.24: Balaam speaks prophecy (about Jesus) and downfall of Israelites' enemies</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.6: Jesus miraculously feeds 5000, Jesus walks on water, Jesus explains that He is Bread of Life</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>24:8: Refer to Numbers 23:22</p> <p>24:17: This is referring to Jesus. (Refer to John 5:45-47 that explains that Moses wrote about Jesus)</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>6:7: denarii is a unit of currency 6:31: This is referring to God's provision of manna (Refer to Ex. 16:15, Numbers 11:7)</p> <p>6:42: They only knew Him as human, not also as Divine</p> <p>6:45: Refer to Isaiah 54:13</p> <p>6:49: Note parallel of manna from heaven and Jesus being bread of life</p>	<p>Jesus is eternal. He always has been, and always will be.</p>	<p><u>Numbers 11 + John 6:49-51</u></p> <p>There is a beautiful parallel between these passages of scripture. God provided manna (bread-like substance) from heaven as a supernatural provision for the Israelites to eat. In John 6, Jesus explains that He is the bread of life, that surpasses any manna that was provided for temporary filling. What was in the Old Testament was temporary, leading up to the permanent Ultimate sacrifice of Jesus Christ.</p>

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<p>DAY 76 MARCH 17</p> <p>NUMBERS 25 JOHN 7</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.25: Israelites are worshiping idols, Moabite woman attempts to seduce Israelite</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.7: Jesus at Feast of Tabernacles, crowd debates who Jesus is</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>25:11: "jealousy"= God wants us fully devoted to Him, with no other idols</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>7:15: Culturally, they had to study to become rabbis and know scripture, and Jesus didn't follow tradition, but still knew scripture and was able to teach it (Refer to John 1:1-5)</p> <p>7:27: They were still trying to justify how Jesus couldn't be the Messiah</p> <p>7:33-34: Jesus is referring to His ascension after His death, burial, and resurrection</p> <p>7:29: Holy Spirit (Helper) was sent as a comforter after Jesus's ascension (Refer to John 16:7)</p>	<p>God will prove Himself to us as the One true God. How we respond when He reveals Himself is up to us.</p>	
<p>DAY 77 MARCH 18</p> <p>NUMBERS 26 JOHN 8</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.26: Another census is taken among the Israelite tribes</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.8: Woman caught in adultery is brought to Jesus, crowd continues to debate on who Jesus is</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.26: The entire chapter focuses on the census. The census was used to determine the size of land allotted to each tribe</p> <p>26:61: Refer to Leviticus: 10:1-2</p> <p>26:65: Refer to Numbers 14:28-38</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>8:5: Refer to Leviticus 20:10 & Deuteronomy 22:22</p> <p>8:58: Refer to Exodus 3:14</p>		

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<p>DAY 78 MARCH 19</p> <p>NUMBERS 27 JOHN 9</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.27: Law made for familial inheritance, Joshua arranged to be leader to succeed Moses</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.9: Jesus heals blind man on Sabbath, continued discussion/ division on who Jesus is</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>27:14: Refer to Numbers 20:11-12</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>9:2: It used to be the customary belief that disease was inherited due to sin from one's self or from their family's sin</p>	<p>When Jesus came, He broke down a lot of "tradition". Those who were so focused on rules were missing out on the miracles taking place right in front of them.</p>

After all, He is the Good Shepherd. We can follow His lead.</p>	
<p>DAY 83 THURS MARCH 24</p> <p>NUMBERS 32 JOHN 14</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.32: 3 tribes decide to not fully settle in Canaan (Promised Land)</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.14: Jesus prepares people for His ascension & gives assurance of Holy Spirit to come</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>32:8: Refer to Numbers Chapter 13 where spies were sent to scout the land of Canaan</p> <p>32:12: Refer to Numbers 14:24, 14:38</p> <p>32:13: Refer to Numbers 14:33-35</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>14:6: Jesus' sacrifice gave us access to God the Father</p> <p>14:16-17: Jesus is referring to the Holy Spirit</p> <p>14:30: "ruler of this world"= Satan</p>	<p>God has prepared a place and a way for us. God prepared the Promised Land for the Israelites and guided them to it. God has prepared a place for us as well, made possible through the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, and He guides us there. The Holy Spirit is a Helper for us here on Earth.</p>

<p>DAY 84 FRIDAY MARCH 25</p> <p>NUMBERS 33 JOHN 15</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.33: Israelites' journey into Promised Land, Aaron dies, Command by God to conquer Canaan</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.15: Jesus teaches the parable of the True Vine & warns disciples to anticipate tribulation/persecution</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>33:4: God will make sure that you triumph in the face of your enemies</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>15:15: It's an honor to be called His Friend!</p> <p>15:25: Refer to Psalm 35:19, 69:4</p> <p>15:26: "Helper"= Holy Spirit</p>	<p>God will not only lead you to the place He has prepared for you, but give you authority over it when you arrive!</p> <p>God is also such a Good Shepherd that He lets us know when danger or obstacles are ahead.</p>	
<p>DAY 85 SATURDAY MARCH 26</p> <p>NUMBERS 34 JOHN 16</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>Ch.34: God gives specific instructions to Israelites of what land was promised to them, Leaders are assigned to divide Canaan's inheritance</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.16: Promise of the Holy Spirit/ what the Holy Spirit will do, Jesus gives another reminder of His upcoming ascension</p>	<p>NUMBERS</p> <p>34:14-15: Remember Numbers 32</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>16:7: Jesus accomplished what He needed to, and then had to leave in order for the Holy Spirit to come</p> <p>16:33: Jesus gave reassurance to His disciples even though He was leaving</p>	<p>God will guide us into everything He has planned for us, if we allow Him to. Also, He will never leave us.</p>	

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WEEK 13 (DAY 86-DAY 92)

INTRO TO DEUTERONOMY:

- 5th book of Old Testament
- Last book in Pentateuch (1st 5 books of the OT)
- Author: Moses
- Title of book is translated to mean “2nd Law” because most of the writings in this book is a repeat of what has been written in Exodus, Numbers, and/or Leviticus
- Many prophecies are found in the book, foreshadowing to Jesus

INTRO TO PROVERBS:

- This book is in the category of “Books of Wisdom”
- The main theme: Wisdom
- This book has several authors, but majority of the chapters were written by Solomon

<p>DAY 87 MON MARCH 28</p> <p>DEUTERONOMY 1 JOHN 18</p>	<p>DEUTERONOMY</p> <p>Ch.1: Recap of Israel @ Horeb, Spies sent to Canaan, and Israel's disobedience</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>Ch.18: Judas' Betrayal, Jesus arrested/taken to High Priest, Peter denies Jesus, Jesus receives death sentence</p>	<p>DEUTERONOMY</p> <p>1:4: Refer to Numbers 21:24,33</p> <p>1:22-25: Refer to Numbers 13</p> <p>1:35: Refer to Numbers 14</p> <p>1:37: Refer to Numbers 20</p> <p>1:38: Joshua, who is the successor to Moses, will lead the Israelites to the Promised Land</p> <p>JOHN</p> <p>18:11: The prophecy had to be fulfilled.</p> <p>18:17: Peter's 1st denial of Jesus</p> <p>18:25: Peter's 2nd denial of Jesus</p> <p>18:27: Peter's 3rd denial of Jesus</p>	<p>Jesus knew what needed to be done for prophecies to be fulfilled, and for the world to be saved. Remember that the Passover was foreshadowing of Jesus</p> <p>19:24: Refer to Psalm 22:18</p> <p>19:30: "It is Finished" was more than just Jesus' "last words". This statement shows that all prophecies regarding the Messiah coming were fulfilled.</p> <p>19:36: Refer to Psalm 34:20, Exodus 12:46, Numbers 9:12</p> <p>19:37: Refer to Psalm 22:16-17, Zechariah 12:10, Revelation 1:7</p>	<p>Scriptures all point to Jesus coming to earth and being Messiah. So much was being fulfilled as Jesus was crucified. He was the Ultimate Sacrifice to be made. God is Sovereign.</p>	<p>John 19:24 + Psalm 22:18</p> <p>Psalm 22 is full of prophecy and foreshadowing to Jesus being crucified. John 19:24 refers back to Psalm 22:18.</p>
